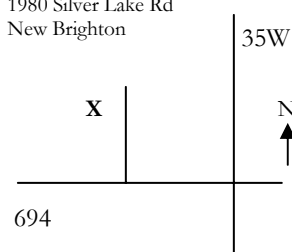

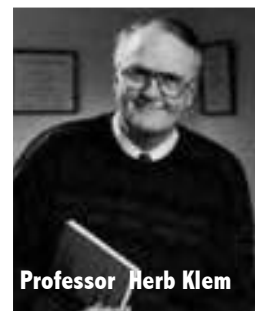


Rev. Richard H. Coleman

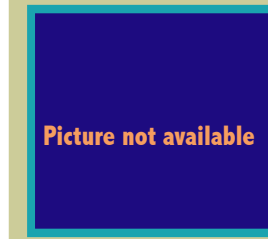

Pastor Paul Betikku was born in Idanre in Ondo State, Nigeria. He graduated from C.A.C. Bible School in Nigeria. In 1980 he immigrated to the United States and attended North Central University in Minneapolis. He started Faith Commu-

nity Church, a non-denominational Evangelical multi-cultural church in the Twin Cities. Paul has led many short-term mission trips to Nigeria and other African countries. Where he organized and held many revival meetings. He was

chairperson for the 2005 Unity Conference held in the Twin Cities. Paul and his wife Cecilia have three children and live in Crystal.

Pastor Margaret Scott – director of Margaret Scott Ministries with a focus on prayer, reconciliation and outreach evangelism. Margare-

ret is also Pastor of Congregational Care at Roseville Covenant Church in Roseville. Margaret received an MA from Bethel Seminary

and is a former teaching assistant at Bethel Seminary. Margaret has worked with cross cultural issues for many years.

Charles Goah is the senior pastor of the United Christian Fellowship Church in Minneapolis. Charles is a native of Liberia, West Africa. He accepted Christ at the age of 14, and felt called to preach at the age of 18.

Charles is a graduate of the Institute of Biblical Studies at Liberty University, Lynchburg, Virginia. Charles also received a mini-MBA from St. Thomas University in Non-Profit Faith-based Management. Charles
